STEP 2 - EDUCATE THE PARENTS

Offer parent involvement workshops (onsite/online)

- Clear expectations & communications
- How to be involved
- Why be involved



STEP 3 - USE TECHNOLOGY

Communications & Training

- District website
- Email campaigns
- Webinars
- Distance learning lab
- Social media
- Text messaging



STEP 4 - INVOLVE LOCAL BUSINESSES/VENDORS

Reach out....

- Local Employers
- Partners in Education
- Sponsor for Open House
- Tech Night



STEP 5 - DON'T GIVE UP!

Please....do not stop trying to involve parents in their child's education. They are a critical piece of the academic puzzle and need to be on-board at all levels.
